Life-Study of Matthew – Study Guide

Dear brothers and sisters,

We will continue this week's truth pursuit with Message 25 of the *Life-study of Matthew*, entitled The Continuation of the King's Ministry (1). This life-study covers Matt. 8:1 - 9:34, which begins the continuation of the King's Ministry.

Here is an excerpt from this message followed by key verses for pray-reading and questions for your study:

If we would be in the reality of the kingdom today, we need to be poor in our spirit and to be persecuted for the sake of righteousness. The reality of the kingdom today depends mainly upon righteousness. We are ushered into the reality of the kingdom by being poor in spirit. After we have had a change in our mind, we turn to the Lord and become empty in our spirit. In this way the Lord enters our spirit with His heavenly kingdom. From that moment, we begin to live in the reality of the kingdom. By being righteous, we are kept in this reality. However, if we are unrighteous, we are outside the reality of the kingdom. As long as we maintain righteousness, we are preserved in the reality of the kingdom. Examine your daily life. If you are loose, too free, and careless about righteousness, you are immediately separated from the reality of the kingdom. If we would be in the reality of the kingdom today, we must be poor in our spirit, and we must keep ourselves in righteousness, willing even to suffer for the sake of righteousness.

Key Verses for pray-reading: Matt. 5:3, 8:13, Rom. 10:17

Questions:

1. Why is being poor in spirit the key to entering into, and living in, the reality of the kingdom today?
2. What does it mean in our experience to be kept in the reality of the kingdom by living a surpassing righteousness?
3. How does the Centurion's servant boy being healed relate to our salvation and our serving the Lord today?
